Latest Personal Health Care Spending and Medicare spending dollar figures are for 2014 from the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). In order to estimate these figures for 2019-2028, the numbers for 2014 were projected to a starting point of 2019 using growth rate estimates from CMS.

1: Total Personal Health Care Spending (CMS) for 2014 was \$50,109 public and private. Expenditures for personal health care include spending for hospital care, physicians' services, dentists' services, drugs, eyeglasses, and nursing home care. Latest data from 2014, projected into 2019 using average annual growth rates (CMS). Personal Health Care Spending is the largest subset of National Health Expenditures and does not include government administration, net cost of private health insurance, or government public health activities.

2: Annual growth rate in Personal Health Care Spending from CMS.

3: Medicaid spending for 2014, 2015, and 2016 are actual and budgeted amounts for Wisconsin's Medical Assistance programs, which includes BadgerCare, BadgerCare Plus, Family Care, and SeniorCare (Legislative Fiscal Bureau) and projected to 2019 using average annual growth for Wisconsin Medical Assistance programs (2007-2016) (LFB).

4: Medicare spending based on latest federal figures (CMS) for 2014 and projected to 2019 using Average Annual Growth (1991-2014) (CMS)

5: Other public spending includes state spending for government employee health insurance premiums (Dept. of Employee Trust Funds, 2017 CAFR) for 2014-2017 and projected to 2019 using average percentage growth in state premium spending over 2008-2017 (ETF).
